TDA Pledges support for Dental Assistant Educational Programs

The new president of the Tennessee Dental Association, Dr. Thomas S. Underwood, recently reiterated a pledge made by the TDA Dental Assistant Task Force to "support the accredited dental assistant programs in Tennessee."

In a letter dated August 11, 2006, Dr. Underwood stresses the Tennessee Dental Association's "ongoing concern for access to oral healthcare services for all of our citizens as well as our commitment to the accredited dental assisting programs in Tennessee. We are confident that the full-time accredited assisting programs, with the Tennessee Dental Association's assistance, can maintain and enhance the number of dental assistant graduates annually."

On September 1, Dr. Underwood writes, "As approved by the Tennessee dental Association House of Delegates in May, the TDA stands ready to work with the TNDA and Tennessee's accredited dental assisting programs to ensure that each new class consists of a maximum number of dental assistant students."

During the Educator's Conference at the TNDA Fall Conference, educators from dental assisting programs across the state will continue their discussion of ways to increase the number of qualified dental assistants to meet the needs of Tennessee's dentists and their patients.

Dr. Underwood declined an invitation to address the TNDA General Assembly in Nashville on October 14, due to a scheduling conflict.

The TNDA appreciates the support of the TDA for dental assistant education and regrets that the TDA will not be extending an invitation to TNDA to join the TDA at the Annual Session in Nashville in May.

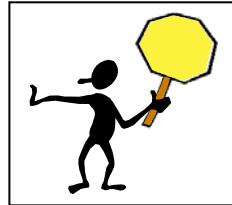

CE Requirements must be met by December 31, 2006

All registered dental assistants are required to fulfill 24 hours of continuing education during the two calendar year cycle (January 1 of an odd year - December 31 of an even year) and keep a current C.P.R. card at all times. Dentists must fulfill 40 hours and registered dental hygienists are required to fulfill 30 hour of CE during the same two-year cycle. A minimum of 2 of the required biennial hours for all dental professionals must be obtained in the area of chemical dependency education.

This article offers dental assistants, hygienists and dentists one (1) hour of Continuing Education Credit in the category of Chemical Dependency as required by the Tennessee Board of Dentistry. The exam will be graded by an officer of the Tennessee Dental Assistants' Association, an approved continuing education provider. A score of 80% or better is required to earn the CE certificate, which will be mailed within 2 weeks of course completion.
